

"Share the Journey"" **Share Lent 2019**

"Imagine that your life is in danger and you have to flee your home. You don't have time to prepare or take anything with you. You must flee now. What would you do? Where would you go? How would you feel? More than 68.5 million people worldwide have faced this situation. In fact, every minute, 31 people are forced to flee their homes to escape war, persecution, large-scale development projects, extreme poverty, or the consequences of climate change.

Children such as Shominara, who fled Burma with her family to escape the persecution suffered by the Rohingya and found refuge in Bangladesh; young women such as Qawthar, who had to flee war in Syria and has now been living in Lebanon for the last six years; women such as Kelly, an Afro-Colombian peasant who was displaced multiple times because of the armed conflict that afflicted her country for 50 years; men such as Amechi in Nigeria, who fled to save his life when armed forces turned their weapons on peaceful protesters asking for fair compensation from an oil company exploiting and polluting their land; and poor coastal communities in the Philippines who saw their homes ravaged by Super Typhoon Haiyan five years ago and faced eviction with nowhere to go.

This Lenten season, Development and Peace and Pope Francis invite us to reach out and encounter migrants and refugees. The Pope has reminded us that, "Faith is an encounter with Jesus, and we must do what Jesus does: encounter others." Together, we are invited to open our hearts and foster a culture of encounter - a culture that requires a deep commitment to go towards others, to stop, listen and really see them, and to give a little of ourselves.

This Lenten season, we are all called upon to be fellow travelers with our sisters and brothers who have had to flee their homes and to share the journey with them. But how?

By giving generously to the Share Lent campaign. Thanks to your support, Development and Peace and its partners can continue to build a world of justice by taking action on the root causes of forced migration and by supporting the most vulnerable populations in the Global South. Together, we can support people such as Shominara, Qawthar, and Amechi."

Fr. Laurence Freeman reflects on Lent telling us that it is "...a time when we refine and purify the spiritual senses and identify the habits or patterns that pollute them. The means of doing this are the exercises we undertake in this season. It is not a time for selfpunishment or repression. Today especially the human psyche is too fragile for that. But when a friend summons up the courage to tell you something you would rather not hear, some exposure of a fault or dishonesty you have been guilty of, do you not (in the end) feel gratitude for their expression of love and concern for you? It is not condemnation, but "repentance" that works to accelerate the spiritual journey. To repent means not to feel guilty, which is a waste of time and spirit. It means to be honest, clear-sighted and courageous enough to change direction.

"Before changing direction, it is best to pause. Lent is a time above all to give more time than we normally think we can afford to the mechanics of our spiritual life. It is not only about giving up, but doing something more or less. Sometimes the two can be nicely balanced - less time watching television, more time reading, going earlier to bed, getting up earlier to meditate, listening to the news just once a day, praying the hours more often, eating less and better, living and communicating more healthily. Of course, good intentions are more likely to be sustained when they are realistic. It is better to slow down gradually before changing direction or you may simply go into a spin. The aim of Lenten discipline is to reverse the momentum of actual or implicit self-rejection and to allow the experience of knowing that we are loved to arise and envelop us. This knowledge (however it comes to us) is in fact the "knowledge of God." The changing of momentum is stillness. Thus, "Be still and know that I am God." (Psalm. 39)"

A poem by Edwina Gateley invites us to trust and be present in our humble prayer. "Be silent. Be still. Alone...Empty...before your God. Say nothing. Ask nothing. Be silent. Be still. Let your God Look upon you. That is all. God knows and understands. God loves you with an enormous love, wanting only to look upon you with Love, Quiet....Still...Be...Let your God love you."
