

First Friday Eucharistic Devotions



Last Thursday we marked the National Day Of Prayer In Solidarity With Indigenous Peoples. The CCCB (Canadian Conference Catholic Bishops) reminded us:"...Colonization has contributed to a hastened deterioration of Indigenous languages. This has resulted in a tragic loss of peoples' culture, identity and language which are important means to understanding the world view of another people. Many Indigenous languages today co-exist with other languages. While such co-existence is important for progress and social development, it can push Indigenous languages to the peripheries, resulting in a serious impact on the sense of communal and personal self-worth, spirituality and mental health of Indigenous peoples. The necessity to preserve Indigenous languages and to transfer knowledge of these languages to the younger generations is an important step towards respecting and revitalizing them....During his Apostolic Journey to the United States and Canada, Saint John Paul II said to Indigenous peoples: "I encourage you, as native people belonging to the different tribes and nations in the East, South, West and North, to preserve and keep alive your cultures, your languages, the values and customs which have served you well in the past and which provide a solid foundation for the future." Underlying popular piety, as a fruit of the enculturated Gospel, is an active evangelizing power which we must not underestimate."

During Advent we are reminded that Jesus' role is not to overturn the world by force, but to persuade by healing and even forgiving his enemies. Is that our approach when we speak and act from our lived faith experience? How and where are we looking for Jesus? In what new and unexpected ways has he come to me and demonstrated he is part of my life? "Each day is a new dawn of that Light of Christ." (Thomas Merton).

Are we finding time in this hectic month to calm down and feed our souls? Get ready and watch out for the surprises of God's presence this coming week.

Whether we are ready or not Christmas will come. We may be filled with joy or sorrow but we still celebrate the gift of Jesus among us. He comes to us as we are. All he asks is a welcoming heart. It can be a time of hope bringing us peace, lasting joy, and a renewed spirit of compassion.
