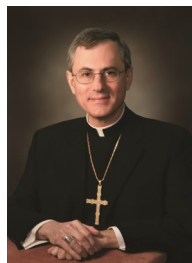

IN THE CHURCH WE ARE ALL MISSIONARIES AND DISCIPLES

"Baptism allows us *to enter the People of God*, to become members of a *People on a journey*, a people on pilgrimage through history. In effect, as from generation to generation life is transmitted, so too from generation to generation, through rebirth at the baptismal font, grace is transmitted, and by this grace the Christian People journey through time, like a river that irrigates the land and spreads God's blessing throughout the world. From the moment that Jesus said what we heard in the Gospel Reading, the disciples went out to baptize; and from that time until today there is a chain in the transmission of the faith through Baptism. And each one of us is a link in that chain: a step forward, always; like a river that irrigates. Such is the grace of God and such is our faith, which we must transmit to our sons and daughters, transmit to children, so that once adults, they can do the same for their children. This is what Baptism is. Why? Because Baptism lets us enter this People of God that transmits the faith. This is very important. A People of God that journeys and hands down the faith.

By virtue of Baptism we become *missionary disciples*, called to bring the Gospel to the world (cf. Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*, n. 120). "All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization.... The new evangelization calls for personal involvement" (*ibid.*) from everyone, the whole of the People of God, a new kind of personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized. The People of God is a *disciple People* — because it receives the faith — and a *missionary People* — because it transmits the faith. And this is what Baptism works in us: it gives us Grace and hands on the faith to us. All of us in the Church are disciples, and this we are forever, our whole lifelong; and we are all missionaries, each in the place the Lord has assigned to him or her. Everyone: the littlest one is also a missionary; and the one who seems to be the greatest is a disciple. But one of you might say: "Bishops are not disciples, Bishops know everything; the Pope knows everything, he is not a disciple". No, the Bishops and the Pope must also be disciples, because if they are not disciples, they do no good. They cannot be missionaries, they cannot transmit the faith. We must all be disciples and missionaries.

There exists an indissoluble bond between the *mystical* and the *missionary* dimension of the Christian vocation, both rooted in Baptism. "Upon receiving faith and Baptism, we Christians accept the action of the Holy Spirit who leads to confessing Jesus as Son of God and calling God 'Abba', Father.... All of us who are baptized ... are called to live and transmit communion with the Trinity, for evangelization is a calling to participate in the communion of the Trinity" (*Final Document of Aparecida*, n. 157).

No one is saved by himself. We are the community of believers, we are the People of God and in this community we share the beauty of the experience of a love that precedes us all, but that at the same time calls us to be "channels" of grace for one another, despite our limitations and our sins. The communitarian dimension is not just a "frame", an "outline", but an integral part of Christian life, of witness and of evangelization. The Christian faith is born and lives in the Church, and in Baptism families and parishes celebrate the incorporation of a new member in Christ and in his Body which is the Church."

In a recent letter Bishop Fabbro wrote to the parishioners of the Diocese of London. He said: "Our diocese entered a Sponsorship Agreement with the Government on 22 July 1979 and has been one of the pioneers of this program. Since 2000, we have sponsored over 2,700 refugees. I would like to acknowledge the compassion, generosity and leadership of our pastors, parish refugee committees and our parishioners. You have worked hard to provide a home for refugees who have come to Canada from countries around the world. I thank you for your hard work, perseverance, countless volunteer hours and financial commitment." Our Cathedral parish has responded very generously over the years. Thank you to all those who contributed in any way. You assisted in making people feel at home when, for them, they had nowhere to go.

Congratulations to Roger Khouri and the recently installed executive of our parish Knights of Columbus. Present at the installation was the K of C District Deputy who called our council the best in his area. I'm not surprised given all the efforts made to support parish and community activities. Congratulations as well to Dave Houghton who received the Knight of the Year Award in recognition of his work as financial secretary and his ongoing commitment to making sure the Knights remain aware of the social needs of our city.

Last Friday we celebrated the Anniversary of the Dedication of St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica. As the principal church in the Diocese of London, it serves as the home of Bishop Fabbro in his role as bishop and chief teacher in the diocese. Major liturgical celebrations of the diocese are always held here. It is a privilege to host the diocesan family on occasions such as the Mass of Christ, the ordination of priests, the rite of candidacy and ordination of deacons, and other events. These celebrations are over and above the liturgical schedule of a busy downtown parish.

If I am thinking about acting in a way that is unwelcome, hurtful or mean-spirited, I, alone, have the ability to do something about it. All it takes for growth in this area is to ask God to remove from me all conditions, expectations and limitations from my treating others with love, dignity and kindness.

Enjoy your summer, catch your breath, and "let your soul catch up with your body."

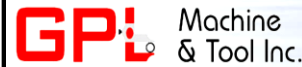

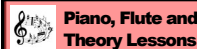
