

The Trinity is the Model of Every Human Community

"The Holy Trinity is a mystery that Scripture does not prove. This Sunday following Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Blessed Trinity. The Triune nature of God is the principal mystery of the Catholic faith. Today we contemplate the first and last horizon of the universe and of history: the Love of God, the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. God is not solitude, but perfect communion.

Our God is rich in relationships, communication and love for all people. This God models to us what the dynamic Trinitarian life is all about – communication, relationship and affection. The quality of our Christian life is based on imitation of the interior life of the Trinity. The Trinity is the model of every human community, from the most simple and elemental, which is the family, to the universal Church. It shows how love creates unity out of diversity: unity of intentions, of thought, of will; diversity of subjects, of characteristics and, in the human realm, of sex. And we see, specifically, what a family can learn from the Trinitarian model.

On Trinity Sunday, rather than try to solve the mystery, let us ask how open we are to it: the mystery of why God created us to begin with; the mystery of God loving us, desiring to be part of our lives, to live in our hearts; to be one with us; the mystery of God inviting us to share in the life of the Trinity: Father, Son and Spirit; the mystery of a God who cares for us like a loving parent, who lays down his life for us like a best friend, who fills our hearts like a lover who will not be refused.

The Christian God is a living being who exists in intimate relationship with us. One of the important dimensions of our Trinitarian God is the community of love and persons modeled for us in the mystery of the Holy Trinity. For Christians, the Trinity is the primary symbol of a community that is held together by containing diversity within itself. The language of Father and Son is relational language, and reminds us that, for God, as for us, created in God's image, relationship and community are primary."

We will gather at the mausoleum at St. Peter's Cemetery, 806 Victoria Street, London at 2:00 pm sharp for a short prayer service. Then we move outside, led by the London Fire Fighters Drum and Pipe Band, Knights of Columbus Honour Guard, along with a bugler to the Veteran Site. Silver Cross Mother Mrs. Carolyn Wilson will lay a wreath at her son's grave site. We then process to the Unborn Child Site and lay a wreath and short pray. Finally, we arrive at WW1Veteran's Site and make our final wreath presentation. This remembrance of life lost, usually takes about 35–45 minutes, please join us, as it is **not** only limited to the Knights of Columbus. It is open to everyone to come and pay their respects.

"Let us pray for all our fathers...for fathers who had no opportunity to know their own dad, for fathers who have none, for fathers who grieve the loss of their dad, for fathers who are chronically or terminally ill, for fathers expecting the birth of a child, for fathers awaiting the arrival of an adopted child, for men who desire to be fathers, for fathers who see the sun rise and sun set in the eyes and smiles of their children, for fathers who are in good relationships with their children and for those who aren't, for fathers who grew up without a dad, for fathers whose hearts break over the troubles their children face, for fathers of children who won't forgive their dad, for fathers who will be forgotten or ignored on this Father's Day, for fathers who work multiple jobs to provide for their families, for unemployed fathers desperately looking for work, for fathers whose sacrifices are unknown to their families, for fathers unable to provide what they want their children to have, for every father mourning the loss of a child he loved, for fathers who are single parents, for divorced or separated fathers who miss their children, for fathers estranged from or barred from seeing their children, for fathers who are in prison, for fathers who have been abused or gone missing, for grand and great-grandfathers who care for their children's children, for teachers and coaches and mentors who've been a "father" to many young people, for all fathers in need of our prayers." Prayer is often seeking God. As an author recently said, "People often ask 'Where is God in my life?' The best response I can give is to ask 'Where are you?' - that's where God is." In this way prayer can be something very practical and steeped in where we really live. In brief, we recognize the divine within ourselves, rather than trying to engage a God out there somewhere. Because just to be is a blessing, to live is holy. Our lives are holy just as they are. If there is one thing Jesus revealed, it is that he loves what he finds. He loves us just as we are. Nothing in our life is distasteful to God. Prayer starts where we really are because God is in us as we are. God doesn't expect us to be any other than we are, except that there is a change that God is going to make in our lives. In a way we don't have to knock, we're in already.
