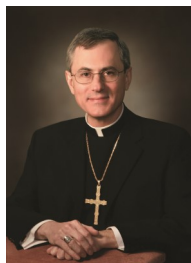

In this second session of presentations she will discuss the following topics: 1) All Are Welcome, 2) Women Disciples, 3) Rich and Poor, 4) Jesus the Rejected Prophet, 5) Prayer and Prophetic Obedience, 6) Fulfillment of Scripture and Empowering Spirit. 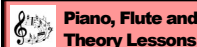
