### Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction at St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica A New Format

It is good to review our pastoral, devotional and liturgical practices from time to time. One of the practices that the pastoral staff has been examining is the traditional devotion of Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament on the first Friday of each month. The main question of our review is, "Are we faithful to the "spirit" and norms as laid out in the various Conciliar and Roman documents that guide our practice of worshipping the Eucharist outside of Mass?" The fact that our period of adoration always follows the celebration of the Mass is the ideal and worthy of praise, because adoration ought to flow from our communion with Christ. What follows the celebration of Mass, as adoration, is what we have examined more closely.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is to be a community experience and not simply a time of prayer for a handful of adorers. There is also an expectation that a period of adoration be supported by hymn singing, proclamation of the Word of God, an extended period of silent prayer and meditation, prayers of intercession or litanies which are then concluded with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The greatest challenge in the vast majority of communities that offer an extended period of adoration is to have a sufficient number of people present throughout the time in which the Blessed Sacrament is exposed. Apart from the short prayers prior to Benediction, we currently do not offer song, praise, or a reflection on the Word of God to accompany the period of adoration.

In order for us draw more deeply from the well of spiritual blessings that can flow from adoration of the Holy Eucharist we have chosen to modify our practice of Eucharistic adoration. We will continue the practice of Exposition and Benediction on the first Friday of the month following the 12:05 PM Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in the monstrance on the main altar of the Cathedral. We will encourage those at Mass, and who are able to remain, to stay with us for a Eucharistic Holy Hour. The minister of the Holy Hour will lead song, prayers of praise, the Word of God, a written or very brief reflection which will be followed by silent adoration. This period will conclude with a litany or intercessory prayers and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will conclude at 1:30 PM.

We want to acknowledge the fact that some people enjoy a much quieter time of prayer and adoration. We remind you that our church is open every day for private Eucharist devotion before the tabernacle. Also, in the city of London, St. Mary's Church at York and Lyle Streets offers perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and is always in need of adorers. We hope you will support them in their special ministry to the city.
