

"Catholic Education: Nurturing Hope"
Catholic Education Week
May 2-7, 2021

"Those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength." (Isaiah 40:31)

The theme for Catholic Education Week 2021, "Nurturing Hope," reminds us that publicly funded Catholic education is a call to service. Publicly funded Catholic education has existed in Ontario since 1841 and its graduates have served Ontario and Canada very well. The current generation of students in our publicly funded Catholic schools will serve with the same spirit and generosity as their previous generations. Regardless of our position or our responsibilities within Catholic education, our role is a call, birthed in our Baptism, to bring the saving message of Jesus Christ into the lives of those students and their families whom it is our privilege to serve.

Each year, the Catholic community of Ontario engages in a week-long celebration of the unique identity and distinctive contributions of Catholic education during Catholic Education Week. This year's celebration is entitled, "Catholic Education: Nurturing Hope" and will be celebrated during the week of May 2 – May 7. The theme for Catholic Education Week 2021 was inspired by the following considerations: recognition of the special Year of Laudato Si' which will run through May 24, 2021; the ongoing reality of the COVID-19 pandemic and the theme celebrated last year "Igniting Hope" which served so well during the spring recess from in-school instruction; the challenges to personal and spiritual well-being posed by the uncertainty and physical isolation of the current global crisis; and the ongoing recognition of the Truth & Reconciliation Commission and the relevance of Indigenous culture and spirituality to the spirit of Laudato Si.

The National Week for Life and the Family
Family, the Domestic Church: A Sign of Hope and Life
May 9-16, 2021

Following the recommendations of the former Ad Hoc Committee on Life and Family of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), the Bishops of Canada at their October 2011 Plenary Assembly adopted a plan to implement a national pastoral initiative for life and family. As proposed at the time, the various elements of this national pastoral initiative could include: strategies for formation; the promotion of life and family; outreach for life; programs for youth and the elderly; and collaboration with ecclesial movements and new communities. Bishops in their respective dioceses would be invited to consider ideas as they are proposed and to adopt and adapt them for local use according to evolving pastoral needs, the availability of resources, and particular priorities.

For the past several years, the CCCB has used the National Week for Life and the Family as a key opportunity to propose ideas related to its national pastoral initiative for life and family. The annual celebration of the National Week for Life and the Family takes place in many dioceses across the country and always coincides with the United Nations' International Day of Families on May 15 of each year.

From the Desk of the Rector

Jesus constantly reminds us that he came into the world as light. To be light the midst of darkness characterizes the mission of Jesus who was sent by the Father and quite appropriately identifies the mission of those -you and me - who are called to continue it in this world today.

Wherever that happens to be for us, you and I are invited to be a steady light of whatever intensity God may have gifted us with. We are called into the process of being a light for other people to help others not look at us but to look at the reality of their own lives in that light that Jesus will always shine on every situation. The Easter season and the time of pandemic we find ourselves in are both helping us to reflect on this. When I slow down and pay attention I can easily embrace the words of Jesus but I can't do it when I'm busy.

Getting to know Jesus through reflecting on the Gospel readings helps me to be more present to my colleagues, my family, and my friends. It helps me be more present to the needs of those in my community and our parish that need my support. I'm also encouraged to ask some honest questions...where do I find myself whenever it is dark? To whom do I go for support? How can I work on clarifying a sense of purpose during this different and difficult time in our history? Who are my role models for living as Jesus teaches us? How does my daily life change whenever I make time for prayer and reflection? Easter can settle and focus us

If we just rested with the words of Jesus "I am the light of the world" and wrestled quietly with what that means in our daily lives, it would be far better than any detailed todo list.

We often hold so much uncertainty in our heart. At times we are anxious and insecure. That is the time to stop and hear God calling our name since he knows how we feel and wants to give us direction. He calls us to the quiet of prayer and the silence of contemplation. If you haven't tried it, try it.

As you see elsewhere in the bulletin this is Catholic Education Week. I have always appreciated the Catholic Graduate Expectations. They call us to be hearers and doers of the Word of God. Here they are. I invite you to think about each one and describe what it says to you. Each expectation has a descriptor attached to it but I'll fill that in next week. For now, what does each one say to you?
