Gestures of Love

"There is always the danger that when we hear a song too often that we become complacent and take it for granted. The same can happened with the readings and gospels we hear when we come to mass. Perhaps this is one of those gospels. We have heard it so often that no longer has any impact on us.

No one ever said the being a follower of Jesus was going to be easy! We are not only asked to have a relationship with God, we are also called and challenged to be aware of and concerned about those with whom we live and work. We are to love our friends and family as we love God and ourselves. We are reminded of this when we read in the bible, how can we love God whom we cannot see and not love our brother or sister whom we do see?

Being a Christian and a follower of Jesus is about relationships. Being a disciple of Jesus is about how I live my daily life in relation to others and God. It is not private thing between God and me. If I say I love God but do not take the time to be aware of and concerned about around those me, then something very important is missing. If I pray, but then ignore those around me at home or in work that need my help, what is the point of me praying? Praying is not about pleasing God or making myself feel better. Prayer is about me nurturing and nourishing my friendship with God. Then, having prayed and precisely because I have prayed, I am asked and called to turn my attention to those around me who need my help, support and love.

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus reminds that whatever we do for each other, we do for and to Jesus himself. Whatever we fail to do for each other, we fail to do for Jesus. The smallest gesture of love can often have the greatest of impacts.

It is often through very small seemingly unimportant deeds, actions and gestures of love that our love for others and our faith can be seen and made visible. One poet wrote that God is the bits and pieces of every day. We should never underestimate the power of a small gesture such as a smile, a hand on a shoulder or a kind word. These small acts of kindness are how in our daily lives how we love God and our brothers and sisters and ourselves with all our heart, mind and soul.

This week, may we be more aware that God is in the bits and pieces of our ordinary daily lives. May we love God with all our heart, soul and mind. May we love our neighbours as we love ourselves."

"For the past 15 years, the Amabile Boys & Men's Choirs have partnered with St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica to present a concert of Remembrance – to honour and remember the millions of military and support personnel who have given their lives so that we may live in freedom and peace.

Each year, about 800 audience members have joined the boys and men in remembering our lost loved ones, and each year we present a different story of service, bravery and sacrifice in song and story. For the 120 boys and men who participate in this concert each year, it is a treasured time of reflection and gratitude – their favourite and most anticipated concert of the season.

With the onset of the pandemic and the necessity to stay isolated, we worried that our annual tradition might have to be cancelled; however, with the assistance and support of many individuals, who were motivated to ensure that we shouldn't forget, we are pleased to bring you a new In Remembrance story from World War I.

This story recounts vignettes of Canada's participation in World War I through the eyes of a father and child. We will meet Major Henry Colbourne, a veterinarian from Winnipeg, who was conscripted at the age of 27 to care for the army's tens of

thousands of horses shipped overseas to war; and the orphan bear cub whom he adopted and named Winnipeg Bear, or Winnie for short.

Through a powerful story narrated by guest actors; exceptional music by the boys and men of Amabile and guest artists; and the breathtaking videography of HOP Studios, this film recalls Canada's involvement in the Great War through the eyes of a father and son as they track the journey of our most famous black bear soldier — Winnipeg Bear — later to be immortalized as Winnie-the-Pooh."

From the Desk of the Rector

How aware am I? Sometimes I think it's true when it's pointed out were it not for the weather many of us would be unable to start a conversation. It's a very safe topic. I know that myself from being in contact with others daily on the elevator. However, it is a good discussion starter. We can look at the sky, smell the air, check the wind and temperature and easily predict what might be in store for the rest of the day. What would it take to move this awareness to other areas of our lives? How can we grow in discerning the day not just from a weather perspective but through discerning not only what's happening in daily living but interpreting what it really means for us. How can we view the bigger picture outside of ourselves? How can I recognize God's presence? Discernment means allowing God to reveal to us how he is working through our lives and the lives of others to affect the flow of human events. I can easily and often miss the meaning of a lot that happens in life. It can be difficult to understand events in the world and allow God to communicate the meaning of what's happening. A good habit to practice is to wonder why all this is happening but do it in the context of prayerful reflection. Becoming habitually aware of what's going on around me keeps me grounded and sensitive to the ways God is acting and calling me to be present. Here's an easy way to allow this to occur... Take 10 minutes each day either in the morning to review the previous day or at night to review the current day following these steps...

- 1. Invite the Holy Spirit to help you see your day as God sees it.
- 2. Be thankful. Name the gifts of your day, and thank God for them.
- 3. Notice God's presence. Where did you feel an increase of faith, hope and love?
- 4. Notice where you felt what seemed like a lack of God's presence. Where did you feel a decrease of faith, hope and love? Why?
- 5. Look to the future. Ask God for the help you need in the day ahead. Conclude with The Lord's Prayer.

Who needs me? Today's Gospel reading encourages us to make our love for God visible by the way we love our neighbour. We've heard that since we were children but it's no less difficult these days as it's meant to include all people, not just those we like or to whom we are naturally attracted. This includes those who are regularly overlooked, and the vulnerable. Giving it some thought, who do I think Jesus is calling me to love this week? What can I do for her/him?
