

A Sign of the Kingdom of God

"Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present.

On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples—they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places.

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness. In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives."

From the Desk of the Rector

Sometimes on the social media platform known as Twitter people will post two photographs side by side. One will have the title "How it started." and the other "How it's going." It may have someone's photo when they first were hired beside a current one to show where their job has taken them through the years. Some will speak of family or their own growth in thought, reflection, life or prayer. In order to facilitate his mission Jesus sent the disciples out in pairs. I'm sure he did that as a model for all of us in the church to follow down through the centuries. We could ask "How's it going?". Do you think he foresaw the arguments that rage in the church, the disagreements in parishes, the competition, and jealousy along with growing individualism? What we find today do you think Jesus would consider it as a scandal, a frustration or embarrassment? Many offer the wish to be left alone. It would be easier to work in peace if I were just left alone to do my work and not have others with whom to collaborate. However, that's not the goal of ministry in the church or parish. We are called to work together not only because it's helpful but because it's central to what we do. Hospitality, touching personal lives, making possible contact with others is at the root of our "preaching". We tell the truth to each other. We choose to be dependent on each other. We bring healing. None of that can be done in isolation. It requires ongoing encounters with other people. Without an encounter our faith remains private and runs the risk of being sterile. How we get along sends a message that we are all about humility, reconciliation, simplicity and love in our service of making the Gospel part of our everyday living. Our prayer should regularly include a desire to be led to get along with others. We are no less missionminded today than were those sent out in pairs.

On Wednesday Pope Francis reminds us during the World Day of the Sick to pray for those who are ill. Of course, we all do this everyday – remembering those at home and in hospitals. We also pray in gratitude for family caregivers and front line medical workers who have been examples of Jesus' healing in our midst. Unfortunately, many have died during the pandemic but many have recovered due to the tireless efforts of family members and medical personnel. We honour them.

February 8th is the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking. In a previous year

Bishop Paul Andre Durocher of Gatineau wrote: "...human trafficking takes many forms. It occurs whenever someone gains a profit from the exploitation of another person through means of coercion, deception or fraud. This exploitation can take many different forms such as sexual exploitation (in the sex trade, one partner exploiting another), labour exploitation in the service agriculture (restaurants, hotels), greenhouses), domestic work (babysitters, nannies, personal care workers, housekeepers) and manufacturing. Forced marriage often leads to both sexual and labour exploitation and, at times, reaches the level of human trafficking." Anti-trafficking advocates have warned that the pandemic is increasing human trafficking. Sr. Jane Wakahiu reflects: "...Those being lured into trafficking work — be it slave labor or sexual trafficking — are those "already struggling" and at risk due to poverty ... COVID 19 has exacerbated dramatic increase in unemployment, reduced or loss of income for individuals working in informal or low wage sectors which leads to vulnerability, and at-risk individuals find themselves in precarious circumstances."

Last week while entering an elevator at LHSC I spotted this "Going Home Checklist" posted for staff.

- Take a moment to think about today
- Acknowledge ONE thing that was difficult on your shift: let it go
- Be proud of the care/service you gave today
- Consider THREE things that went well
- Check on your colleagues before you leave: are they ok?
- Are you OK? Your senior team is here to listen and support you
- Now switch your attention to home: REST and RECHARGE

In this week's Gospel we experience Jesus bringing healing to Peter's mother-in-law. He always extends his hand to us, to lift us up from what is a burden. How do you and I experience his healing power? Who is the comforting hand of Jesus for us? Who sees in us the desire to be supportive and healing of them?
