

#### **Celebrating 135 Years**

On February 15, 1880 Bishop John Walsh, second Bishop of London announced plans for a new cathedral to be built. On June 28, 1885, almost five years after the turning of the first sod, the new St. Peter's Cathedral was formally opened and dedicated by Bishop Walsh on the vigil of the Feast of St. Peter & St. Paul, June 28, 1885. At the opening of the Cathedral Bishop Walsh said:

"The Cathedral is the expression in stone of the great zeal and love for the religion of the noble clergy and generous laity of the whole Diocese; and of their cordial union and co-operation with their Bishop, and it will stand for ages an eloquent and enduring monument of their faith, hope and charity."

Today, 135 years later, St. Peter's Cathedral continues to grow and flourish as a parish, mother church of the Diocese of London, and a place of worship and spiritual nourishment for all those who pass through its doors. May our cathedral continue to be "an enduring monument of faith, hope, and charity of the apostolic people who planted the mustard seed of the Catholic faith in this country". (Bishop John Walsh)

#### Feast of St. Peter & St. Paul; June 29, 2020

"The Apostles Peter and Paul stand before us as witnesses. They never tired of preaching and journeying as missionaries from the land of Jesus to Rome itself. Here they gave their ultimate witness, offering their lives as martyrs. If we go to the heart of that testimony, we can see them as witnesses to life, witnesses to forgiveness and witnesses to Jesus.

Having met Jesus and experienced his forgiveness,

the Apostles bore witness to him by living a new life: they no longer held back, but gave themselves over completely. They were no longer content with half-measures, but embraced the only measure possible for those who follow Jesus: that of



boundless love. They were "poured out as a libation" (cf. 2 Tim 4:6). Let us ask for the grace not to be lukewarm Christians living by half measures, allowing our love to grow cold. Let us rediscover who we truly are through a daily relationship with Jesus and through the power of his forgiveness. Just as he asked Peter, Jesus is now asking us: "Who do you say that I am?", "Do you love me?" Let us allow these words to penetrate our hearts and inspire us not to remain content with a minimum.

#### Re-Opening of St. Peter's Cathedral

### From the Desk of the Rector

Our Cathedral. On Sunday we celebrate the anniversary of our beautiful building. 135 years ago the cathedral was dedicated as a place of worship. As the principal church in the Diocese of London, it serves as the home of Bishop Fabbro in his role as bishop and chief teacher in the diocese. Major liturgical celebrations of the diocese are always held here. It is a privilege to regularly host our diocesan family. These events are over and above the liturgical schedule and ministry of a busy downtown parish serving parishioners and visitors.

**Our Country.** Wednesday, July 1 is Canada Day. As always, we are encouraged to work and pray for justice in our own land and throughout the world. The goods of the earth are meant to be shared by everyone. We are invited to let the message of Jesus guide our actions. We also express our gratitude for being able to live in a beautiful and democratic country. We are blessed.

Our Parish Finances. "How are we doing?" is a question I regularly receive concerning our parish finances. Due to the pandemic our cathedral building and parish offices were closed yet our many operational and financial challenges remained the same. In the midst of all the necessary changes I am happy to report that the Cathedral financial position is reasonably stable at this time. This is due to ongoing offertory and donation contributions from parishioners and support from the Government of Canada through the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy Program. This has been matched by vigorous expense control by the Cathedral staff. I, along with our parish finance committee, appreciate the continuing support from many generous parishioners who are in a position to do so in these challenging times. I also want to thank our finance committee and its chair, Jay Jeffery; our business manager, Brian Galea; and RoseMary Cleary, our parish financial secretary, for their vigilance and stewardship not only during these uncertain days but at all times. We will continue to closely monitor developments and will also continue communicating our financial situation on an ongoing basis.

**Our Freedom.** A number of people recently refused to wear a mask while attending a public gathering where it was difficult to engage in appropriately mandated

physical distancing. One of the comments heard was "I don't have to wear a mask. I am free to do whatever I want." There are many response to that but one from David Foster Wallace in a quote on freedom, which captures a good vision of the concept: "... The socalled real world of men and money and power hums merrily along in a pool of fear and anger and frustration and craving and worship of self. Our own present culture has harnessed these forces in ways that have yielded extraordinary wealth and comfort and personal freedom. The freedom all to be lords of our tiny skullsized kingdoms, alone at the center of all creation. This kind of freedom has much to recommend it. But of course, there are all different kinds of freedom, and the kind that is most precious you will not hear much talk about much in the great outside world of wanting and achieving. The really important kind of freedom involves attention and awareness and discipline, and being able truly to care about other people and to sacrifice for them over and over in myriad petty, unsexy ways every day." It is something worth considering.

Our Choice. Summer is a good time to slow down and think more. Here is something I've thought about. Regularly we are encouraged by Jesus to treat others the way we would like to be treated by them. We know how we want to be treated but extending that to others is the difficult part. However, with effort it can happen. It will take some discipline and some desire. Don't focus only on how others behave. Stop pointing fingers and always wanting to retaliate by arguing who did what first. Often these initial responses decide our behaviour. We sometimes hear the advice "It's not about you/us." For a moment, though, let's make it about us. Nobody else can determine my thoughts and actions. I am the only one who determines how I will react or think. I am the only one who can change my way of acting. If I am thinking about a way that is unwelcome, hurtful or mean -spirited, I, alone, have the ability to do something about it. All it takes for growth in this area is to ask God to remove from me all conditions, expectations, and limitations so I can treat others with love, dignity, respect and kindness.
