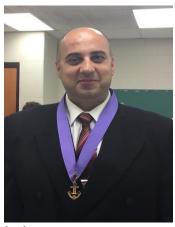

Your annual \$50 membership fees were due December 31, 2020.

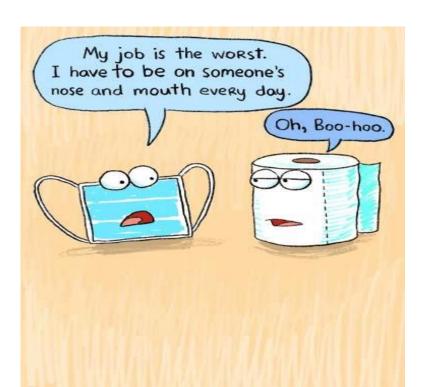
